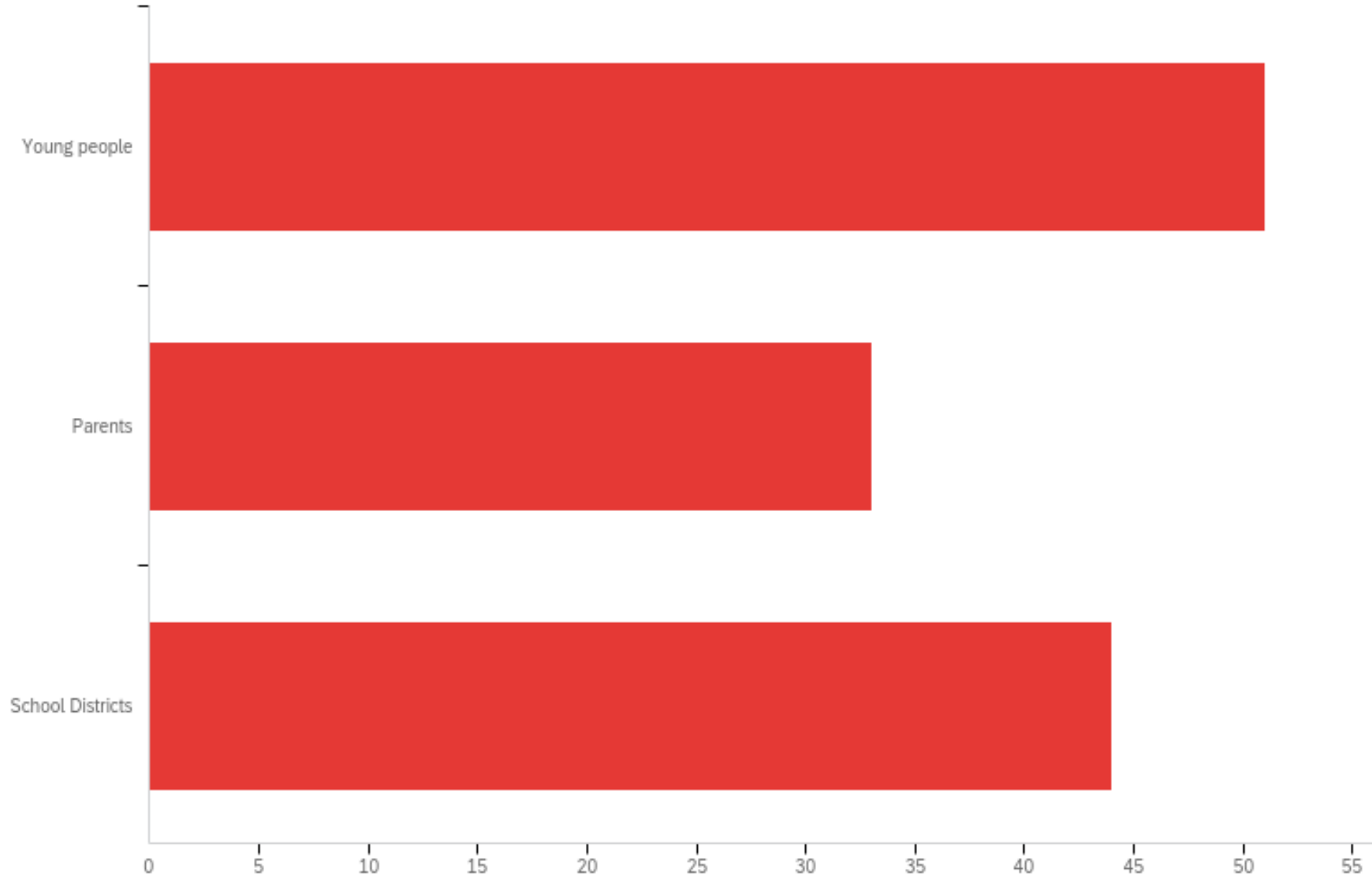

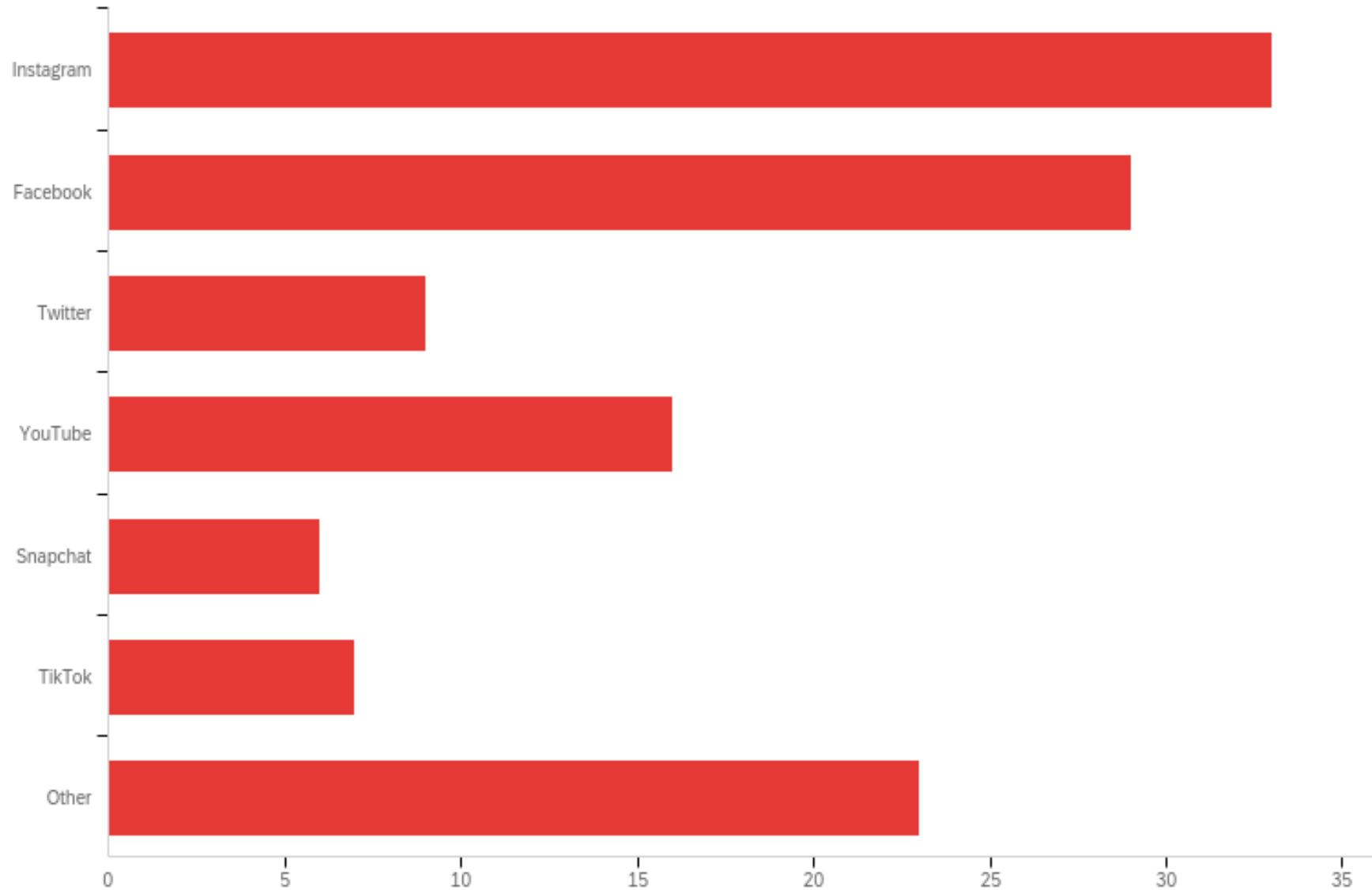

How can ACT for Youth help?

- Help with virtual communication
- Continued communication (e.g. updates, webinars, connection w/other providers and professional development opportunities)
- Clarification re: what it means if we do not meet program requirements (CSL hours, TOP lessons, parent groups, etc.) and what counts towards programming (we are trying our best to continue programming virtually).
- Sharing possibilities for action
- General ideas about where to go with programming at this time/continue programs remotely (green light adaptations)
- Support to see if the NYC Department of Education will allow us to work within their online platforms
- Listing of updated videos to use in BPBR and Cuidate.
- Help doing family planning workshops online
- How to use time efficiently while working from office and/or work if necessary/ best practices for engaging Health Educators with “other” work
- A virtual space (e.g. shared library) to share best practices on virtual engagement and outreach for youth
- Touching base until this is over so we can maintain some kind of connection
- An updated list of social media resources that our youth can have to access online and phone information.
- List of approved content (e.g. documents, Powerpoints, etc) utilized by other programs to send out to their schools.
- Help with video and social media presentations.
