Google Classroom

Free web service for schools

Main purpose: streamline the process of sharing files between teachers and students

It combines Google Drive (**create assignments and distribute**), Google Docs (**writing**), Gmail (**communication**) and Google Calendar (**scheduling**)

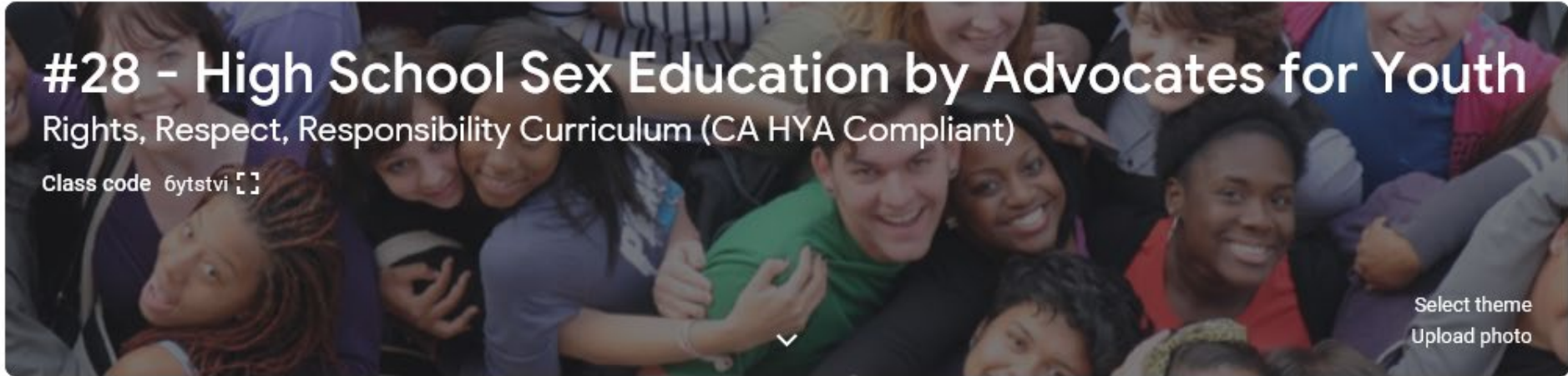
